We really appreciate the assistance of Impact Food Group and their willingness to help us support the 'Children In Need' fundraising appeal.

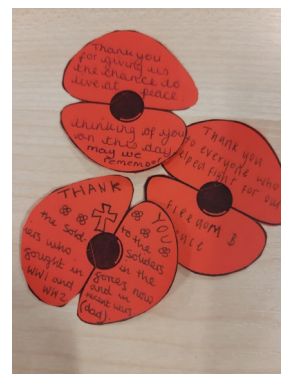
The catering manager and his wonderful team made over 500 Pudsey biscuits which students and staff bought.

Important Information ~ National Rail Timetable Change

A quick reminder about which PE kit your daughter will need to wear to school for days when she has PE.

Pupils should wear:

- Either - navy skort, plain black leggings or plain black or navy tracksuit bottoms (no big logos, mesh, perforations, stripes etc)
- Red PE shirt
- Red or white PE socks
- Sports trainers
- PE fleece (no hoodies, sweatshirts or other non-PE jumpers please)

If your daughter is missing any kit she can purchase clean second-hand kit from the PE office at break and lunch times. All items £1.

Please could you remind your daughter ... NOT to bring aerosols (for example, perfume, deodorants) into school or on school trips. Inhaling chemicals from the aerosols can cause allergic skin reactions, nausea, headaches, asthma and breathing difficulties for many of our staff and students. If your daughter is found to be in possession of an aerosol in school or on a school trip, the item will be confiscated and made available for your collection from Reception. Year 10 Work Experience Week

Please note our week in March has been postponed.

Work experience will run in the following 3 sessions and we have renamed it 'Experiencing a Work Place'.

Session one : 1 and 2 February

CV writing and interview technique workshops will be run during your daughter's PD and Core PE lessons, lessons 4 and 5 on the above dates.

Session two: National Careers Week, 1–5 March

In addition to the whole school activities run during this week, Year 10 students will be invited to attend mock interviews and we will be holding talks from areas of interest that relate to their option choices.

Session three: Experiencing a Work Place, 17 – 21 May 2021

For this session there will be three options for you and your daughter to choose from.

1. 'Private placement', this would mean going to work with a relative or yourself to a place of work. (A Health & Safety agreement would be signed but there would be emphasis placed on the responsibility of the parent/carer that your daughter is your responsibility)
2. 'Experiencing a Work Place', your daughter will be directed to the FROG work experience page which will have a list of placements available to them. (A Health & Safety agreement would be signed and H&S would be the responsibility of the employer)
3. Your daughter can 'opt-out' of Experiencing a Work Place and will carry out various activities within school that relate to being in a work environment

The deadline for booking a placement or choosing to 'opt out' is **Friday 26 February**. Students who have not booked their placement by the deadline will remain in school and take part in 'Option3'.

Due to Covid-19 and the impact this may have had on businesses in Worthing and the surrounding areas, there may be less availability to our students. If you think you may be able to host a private placement for your daughter, a list of protocol's can be found on the 'Experiencing a work place' FROG page which will need to be considered before saying yes.

All work experience planning is subject to the government guidelines relating to Covid-19 and for this reason I must make you aware that placements may not go ahead, in which case 'Option 3' would be put in place for all students unless we are subject to a local/national lockdown.

A video presentation of the above plans will have been shown to your daughter in her PD lesson and I will be available to help them via lunchtime meetings, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays in AR3 or AR4, via email or the FROG page 'wall'.

Interview information

Worthing College – application's that are received before the Christmas holidays will be guaranteed their subject choices. They are not asking for a personal statement on their application. Once you have applied you will need to book your Course Guidance Meeting using a link on an email from the college. These meetings will be held on the telephone; please chose a time outside of the school day, there will be a number of sessions available on our INSET day, **Friday 4 December**.

BHASVIC and **Varndean College** are extending their priority application date to **Monday 4 January 2021**. The requirement to only apply to one college will remain – this is to enable both colleges to plan their curriculum and staffing effectively so that they can offer you the subjects you have chosen in your interview.

Varndean College don't ask for a personal statement but there is a section on the form that asks about any future plans, i.e. what you might like to do after college, if you want to go on to University. They are hoping to hold their admissions interviews at the end of January, face to face, at the college, however this will be dependent on the situation at the time. There will be an option to have a phone/video interview if needed.

BHASVIC don't ask for a personal statement on their application form, and have not yet released interview information.

Steyning Grammar Sixth Form do have the option for you to add additional information to support your application, so you can add some sentences about yourself if you would like to. They are hoping to follow their usual admission plans and invite students in for a short meeting to discuss their application and course choices. This will be arranged by invitation for a meeting **late January / early February**. They will be able to arrange this meeting virtually if the current situation continues.

Collyers have a personal statement section on their application form. It doesn't have to be completed in one sitting, but the application must be submitted before the **deadline at the end of January**. Students will be invited to interviews at the college on **9 February 2021**. The College will send an invitation to you via email. They will advise should this change.
