Students and staff enjoyed wearing something fun, such as spots and stripes together, colours that clashed, long brightly coloured socks and clothing that was red in colour.

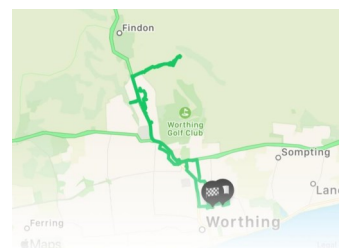
We were delighted to raise over £1,052 and had lots of fun doing so. Thank you to everyone who supported this event!

Can you help by collecting used stamps for the RNIB ~ the Royal National Institute of Blind People. If you receive cards and letters through the post, please save the stamps. The RNIB will recycle these stamps into much needed funds for their services. They accept all stamps: new or used, first or second class, first day covers, presentation packs or albums.

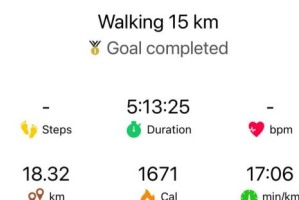
Stamps are sold by weight and raise £20 per kilogramme. You might own or work in a business which receives a large amount of post. Stamps don't need to be sorted, just leave a 1cm of envelope or packaging around each stamp. This will ensure the perforations of the stamp aren't damaged.



Pop your stamps into an envelope or container once you have a sufficiency and hand them into reception ~ thank you.

FODS have a new fundraising scheme which will support our school to raise extra funds through textile recycling, whilst doing something really positive for the environment and reinforcing the importance of recycling within our school community.



Astra Recycling is a Hampshire based textile recycling company, trading since 2013. They are members of the Textile Recycling Association, who ensure business operate to the highest ethical and environmental standards in textile recycling. Their mission is to divert used textiles away from land fill.

Davison will be taking delivery of a recycling textile bank in the next few weeks. The textiles bank will be positioned on the tarmac area outside of the school gates. Astra Recycling will pay 0.20p per kilo for what we collect.

They will accept and pay for the following items:

- Men's, women's and children's clothing
- Paired Shoes
- Handbags, bags, ties and belts
- Bed clothes, towels, soft toys

The following items cannot be accepted and will not be paid for:

- Duvets both synthetic and feathered
- Pillows & cushions
- Carpets & Rugs
- Soiled or wet clothing
- Workwear
- Shredded or mutilated textile material
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

The textiles/items collected are sent to poorer communities across Eastern Europe and Africa. Garments that cannot be used are recycled into insulation materials and industrial cleaning wipes, so nothing ends up in landfill. **Once the textiles recycling bank is in place we will let you know, its time to tidy out your cupboards!**

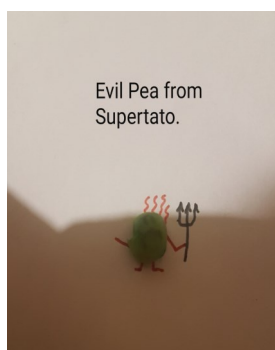

Students were asked to enter a competition using fruit and vegetables as the inspiration for a book or book character.

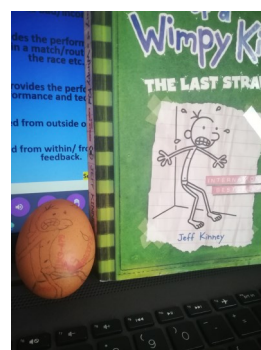

Entries are judged on suitability of fabrics and components, range of techniques used in the make and originality of the idea.

Weekly Challenges:

Monday 19 April ~ Promoting fashion revolution week. Transformation challenge. Turn a t shirt into a new product.

Monday 26 April ~ Lets protect ourselves. Make a face covering.

Monday 3 May ~ Organisation is key. Make a holdall for a collection of objects.

Monday 10 May ~ Transformation challenge. Make a hat from rubbish.

Monday 17 May ~ We all need a hug. Make a plushie toy.

Monday 24 May ~ Small changes to save the planet and show our identity. Make and decorate a tote shopping bag.

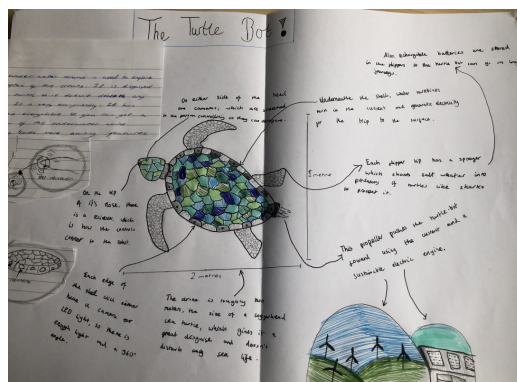

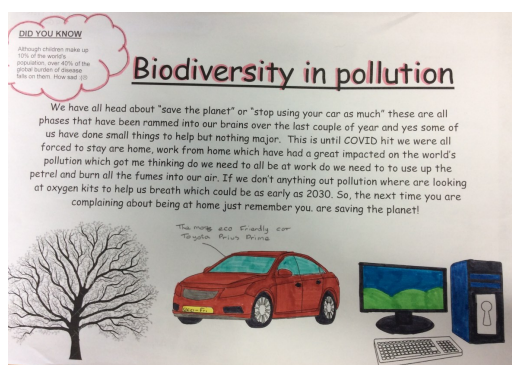

A quick reminder about which PE kit your daughter will need to wear to school for days when she has PE.

Pupils should wear:

- Either - navy skort, plain black leggings or plain black or navy tracksuit bottoms (no big logos, mesh, perforations, stripes etc)
- Red PE shirt
- Red or white PE socks
- Sports trainers
- PE fleece (no hoodies, sweatshirts or other non-PE jumpers please)

If your daughter is missing any kit she can purchase clean second-hand kit from the PE office at break and lunch times. All items £1.

Please could you remind your daughter ... NOT to bring aerosols (for example, perfume, deodorants) into school or on school trips. Inhaling chemicals from the aerosols can cause allergic skin reactions, nausea, headaches, asthma and breathing difficulties for many of our staff and students. If your daughter is found to be in possession of an aerosol in school or on a school trip, the item will be confiscated and made available for your collection from Reception. We welcome your support in protecting the health and wellbeing of **all** our school community and thank you, in advance, for your understanding in this matter.

Davison offer a second-hand uniform service, supplying various sizes of uniform items (subject to availability) at very reasonable prices. We also hold a very limited stock of unembroidered PE kit.
