On Wednesday 11 May, students and adults alike enjoyed an alternative timetable afternoon, both on and off-site. This was in support of Mental Health Week, where this year's theme was 'Loneliness'.

It was our mission to offer a wide range of activities for adults and students to enjoy together. We wanted to promote a sense of 'togetherness' and 'community', so it gave us great pleasure to see students of all ages and from different colour families come together to try new things or connect with their common interests.



A huge thank you to our fantastic staff team who offered to plan and lead such a wonderful range of activities. There were over 40 activities on offer and every student was given one of their three choices.

Activities included: contemporary dance, speed stacking, writing poetry, scavenger hunt, beach walk, making ceramic bird feeders, gardening, painting pebbles, watching films, photography, optical illusions, Just Dance, decoupage, quiz, animation workshop, handbells and boomwhackers, decorating biscuits, weights room, mindful doodling, old school children's party, The Cube: science games, football, film making, knitting, reading, needle-felting, cooking, film making, transfer printing bookmarks, drawing nature, board games, Lego, ballet, fashion card engineering, badge making, debating, card games, puzzles and wordsearches, colouring, football, card making and anime drawing.

As a school, we have adopted the 5 Ways to Wellbeing approach and saw this in abundance across the afternoon.

CONNECT- The activities encouraged us to connect with those in our school community that we may not have had the opportunity to be with before.

BE ACTIVE- Through our engagement and participation in the activities we signed up for, we were active. Some of these activities were particularly energetic!

TAKE NOTICE- We were aware of others in our group, mindful in the activity we were doing and took time to appreciate how our chosen activity made us feel.

KEEP LEARNING - Many of us chose to try something new, others of us learnt new things about ourselves and our ability to step out of our comfort zones when working with new people.

GIVE – With our rescheduled non-school uniform day also on this day, we raised an amazing £978.46 which will be shared between the local mental health charity, Heads On, and Friends of Davison School (FODS).

Here are some of the things staff and students shared about the afternoon:

'My activity was really chilled and it was good not to have to 'think' for the afternoon. I think we should keep Wellbeing Wednesday, especially for before GCSEs.'

'It was refreshing to do something outside of the norm for the afternoon and to connect with students in a different way. For my own wellbeing, I felt it was a positive change that made me feel good.'

'With our GCSEs around the corner, it was a good stress relief and made sure I had a break from revising.'

'My activity taught me a new skill that will support my wellbeing in the future. I have carried on with the crochet I started.'

'It was good to be able to share something I am passionate about with the students.'

'I thought the afternoon was really fun. There were loads of activities and choice.'

'I enjoyed teaming up with another member of staff from a different department. I would definitely like to repeat the afternoon!'

'I did something new and I really like that I could do that.'

'It was really fun and it was good to see everyone doing things they wanted to do.'

'I felt much more relaxed afterwards.'

'It was nice to meet different students - ones I don't normally teach.'

'I think it was good for helping me get to meet new people. I got talking to one girl and now we are friends.'

'It was nice to plan something to do with the students that was out of my subject area.'

'I thought it was so wonderful. Thank you so much for organising it for us.'

'I did 'drawing nature' and I loved getting out in the real world to enjoy drawing our pictures.'

'There was such a buzz around school – both in anticipation of the afternoon, but also on the day – such happy sounds coming from different areas of the school!'

Updated Guidance in relation to Covid-19

Children and young people aged 18 and under with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days, which is when they are most infectious. They can return to school on day 4, provided they no longer have a high temperature.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.



Due to the very high level of trespassing on the tracks by young people in the local area, Network Rail in partnership with the Learn Live News Channel are working to help raise awareness to students across the UK educating them about the dangers of the train tracks through interactive digital delivery.

We would ask you to please watch the relevant safety video and then, watch it with your children. The session is less than 15 minutes and explains why it is important to stay safe near the tracks. Over 14 million students, parents and teachers from across the UK have watched these videos which has led to a significant decrease in the number of trespasses in their area through watching the latest rail safety videos.

PE Kit Reminders

The PE department would just like to give a quick reminder of correct PE kit for lessons.

The correct kit is as follows: Red T-shirt, navy blue skort, plain black or navy tracksuit bottoms (no big logos of stripes), plain black leggings (no big logos or stripes), black leotard, white socks, red football socks, shin pads, navy blue school logo fleece (no alternative jumpers allowed), sports trainers (no converse/ vans style shoes).

If your daughter is missing any kit or would like to purchase extra, we have a small range of second hand kit which we sell from the PE office for £1 per item. Students may come to the PE office at a break or lunch to purchase anything they may need.

If your daughter has recently has her ears pierced please provide tape to cover them during PE lessons for the first 6 weeks. After this time, earrings will need to be removed during PE lessons for safety.

The School Governors have approved that a navy blue tailored trouser be permitted as an alternative to the school skirt. The trouser must be a regulation item which displays the school logo. A reminder to name school uniform please, especially jumpers and coats that are often removed in school and once in lost property they are difficult to re-unite without being named, thank you.

Please could you remind your daughter ...

NOT to bring aerosols (for example, perfume, deodorants) into school or on school trips. Inhaling chemicals from the aerosols can cause allergic skin reactions, nausea, headaches, asthma and breathing difficulties for many of our staff and students. that signing in and out during the school day should be at Student services. (other than at DEAR time when they come to Reception) . Thank you

that she should have a water bottle with her and encourage her to have breakfast before coming to school. Thank you.
