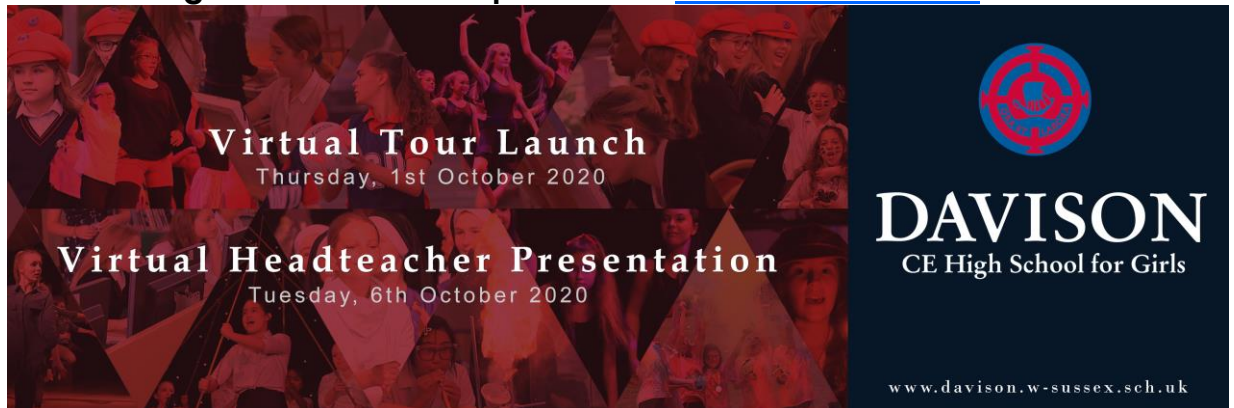
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Whole School

With the desperate need for PPE in the NHS, this was a 'call to arms' for all schools and local business to support our doctors and nurses.

I came back determined to champion their work and to try and give more kids a fighting life chance. What I planned to do was nothing compared with the obstacles they overcome.

I completed my run on the 29th July and my time was 5hrs 13mins, I blame my pacer for setting a hot pace! Extra-Curricular clubs - the PE department are happy to announce that after school clubs are now back up and running! Sessions are being run with individual year group bubbles on different nights. If you daughter has signed up for a place at any of the clubs and been notified she has a spot, please ensure she has diarised all the date that she will need to attend. These dates and all further information on PE clubs can be found on our department site on FROG under the extra-curricular clubs tab.

A quick reminder about which PE kit your daughter will need to wear to school for days when she has PE or after school PE clubs.

Pupils should wear:

- Either - navy skort, plain black leggings or plain black or navy tracksuit bottoms (no big logos, mesh, perforations, stripes etc)
- Red PE shirt
- Red or white PE socks
- Sports trainers
- PE fleece (no hoodies, sweatshirts or other non-PE jumpers please)

If your daughter is missing any kit she can purchase clean second-hand kit from the PE office at break and lunch times. All items £1.

Please could you remind your daughter ... NOT to bring aerosols (for example, perfume, deodorants) into school or on school trips. Inhaling chemicals from the aerosols can cause allergic skin reactions, nausea, headaches, asthma and breathing difficulties for many of our staff and students. If your daughter is found to be in possession of an aerosol in school or on a school trip, the item will be confiscated and made available for your collection from Reception. We welcome your support in protecting the health and wellbeing of **all** our school community and thank you, in advance, for your understanding in this matter

Information on Year 11 Post 16/College options

The Autumn Term is when your daughter learns more about Post 16/College options.

During the week of 21st September five Post 16 Option Assemblies were held using our Teach Stream platform, informing Yr11 about Worthing College, Northbrook MET, Chichester College, Apprenticeships and Sussex University.

College guidance meetings are taking place with Mrs Wood. There are still spaces available before Christmas, so if your daughter has not yet signed up please ask her to do so. The sign-up sheet is on the science corridor, near SC8. If your daughter has met with Mrs Wood, notes from their discussion should be available for you to read on FROG, under RESULTS and ATLS.

Our Post 16 Information Evening is sadly unable to take place this year. Further information will follow about an alternative arrangement.

We wanted to share with you some information that may help making the decisions about progressing after Year 11 a little easier for your daughter:

- Your daughter can make as many applications to different colleges/6th forms as she wishes and does not need to make a final decision until she receives her GCSE results.
- If a Grade 4 in GCSE English Language or Maths is not achieved, the college will arrange additional timetabled sessions for these to be taken again, alongside the chosen college course.
- Arrangements for Open Events are different this year, most will be virtual.

Please check individual college websites for their open event information, some are still deciding on what they are doing.

Please try to attend open events of any college or 6th forms that are of interest to your daughter. If there is an option to talk to course tutors I would encourage you and your daughter to find out as much information as you can.

- Before selecting courses, your daughter should consider the way she prefers to learn and select courses that support this way of learning. Some people are more practical learners whereas others prefer theory along with exams. Practical learners may prefer BTECS, T Levels or CAMTECs and those students who enjoy more academic subjects may opt to study A levels.
- If your daughter is going to be attending a 6th form to take A Levels/BTECs/CAMTECs she will need to select 3 course, equivalent to 3 single courses. Each course will have course entry requirements relating to the GCSE grade needed to take this course, these need to be checked carefully to ensure that your daughter will attain that grade, otherwise she may not be able to get onto that course

- If your daughter is going to take a Level 1 or Level 2 course, which are further GCSEs or equivalent, then she will generally only need to select one course as these provide multiple qualifications on completion.
- If your daughter is going to take a Level 3 course at a college, e.g. an Extended Diploma, then she will only select one course as these are equivalent to 3 A Levels and provide a full timetable.
- Your daughter should have a Plan B, so that if she does not get into her first choice of 6th form or college, she has an offer for another 6th form or colleges that she can opt for.
- Your daughter could also look at apprenticeships which are available in many different occupations and further information can be found <https://www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship>
- If your daughter is considering university then she can find out more information on the UCAS website, information can be found on <http://www.ucas.com>
- BHASVIC and Varndean close their applications on Friday 4th December, you CANNOT apply to both.

The Careers page within FROG has lots of useful links to websites, videos and a number of 2021/22 college prospectuses under the Further Education – Post 16 tab. Parents and students have access to this within FROG, please make use of it.
