- The purpose of **defibrillators** and when one might be needed

As this competition was a qualifying event, students who came in the top 2 positions for their event also went on to compete at the South East Schools Inter-Counties fixture!



The Bronze Arts Award


During the summer term 2022, 30 year 8 students were invited to join a Creativity & Wellbeing partnership project between Davison, Chichester Festival Theatre (CFT) and Mind. The aims of the project were:

- ♦ For students to have a positive experience and have fun!
- ♦ To develop good relationships and positive communications with each other.
 - ♦ To feel a sense of pride and celebration in their achievements both individually and collectively.
 - ♦ To feel confident in trying new experiences.
 - ♦ To have a positive sense of self.
 - ♦ Learn new skills.

Each session after school was led by a different practitioner/artist from CFT. The sessions were engaging and active, with plenty of

laughter. Following the project, seven of these students chose to work towards the Bronze Arts Award, using their experience of the project to help them evidence their skills and commitment.

The Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is open to young people aged 11 to 25. To achieve a Bronze Arts Award, young people collect evidence in an individual arts log or portfolio of their experiences of:



- experience of at least one arts event/experience as an audience member and their review of that event/experience
- researching the career and work of an artist or craftsperson that inspires them
- experience of passing on an arts skill



The Arts Award moderator assessed the awards and reviewed the work these seven students submitted. The report back described how he was so incredibly impressed with the work produced by Lottie, Ruby, Faith, Ava, Nell, Chloe and Amy.

We are delighted that all 7 awards have 'passed with flying colours.'

Some additional comments included, "It was an absolute delight to moderate the young people's portfolios, full as they are of deep learning, creativity and thoughtful reflection – it's really impressive how they have all engaged so thoroughly" The moderator also suggested that these "young people would be perfect candidates for progressing on to Silver." We will certainly be looking into whether this is something

we might be able to support them with in school.

We are really proud of what these students have achieved and of their commitment to working with Mrs Jameson (Wellbeing Lead) on this project.







Last week our year 7 STEM engineers participated in the Dragon's Den rocket challenge.

During this enterprising event, the enthusiastic Year 7 students eagerly took on the challenge of **designing and constructing water rockets**. Filled with excitement and curiosity, they gathered in teams, **armed with their imaginations** and only 50 Davison Dollars to spend at the **rocket shop** on a range of materials!

Guided by Miss Isted and Miss Bushnell, they shared ideas and **sketched aerodynamic designs.** They also showcased their **creativity and communication skills** by making a pitch about their rocket design. With **precision and teamwork**, **they meticulously assembled their rockets**.

Launch time approached, with the **grand finale** on the school field! **Rockets soared high**, reaching astonishing altitudes before gracefully descending back to earth. Two rockets impressively landed on the **school roof**, much to the delight of the year 7s (and the Premises Team)!

The water rocket challenge on this STEM enterprise day **ignited their passion for STEM** and, we am sure, left a lasting impact on their educational journey. **A great day had by all!**

Solar Panels at Davison

In July 2019, 964 **solar photo voltaic cells** were installed on the rooftops of parts of the **Davison building**.

The system is owned by the council and we still have to pay for the electricity we use, but the **cost to us is much cheaper than usual**. Any electricity we don't use is **sold back to the grid** to be used by anyone!

Studybugs 👽

Could we politely ask that if your child is unwell for school, that you report this on Studybugs by 8.30am. This allows us to safeguard effectively as a school.

The 'Studybugs' app can also be used to notify us if your child has an appointment and needs to leave early using the option 'send other message'. The app is quick and easy to use and install; absences are then automatically added to our registers, eliminating any unnecessary absence texts to you. Please <u>click here</u> to get started. If you are having problems with Studybugs, please ensure we have the correct email address on file ~ email addresses not on file will not be recognised.

Pupils must inform their teacher if they are feeling unwell and a member of the medical team will see them.

Students are requested not to call home; any student who bypasses this process and is collected without being seen by the medical team will have their absence recorded as unauthorised.

Maths Equipment

Please ensure that your child has the correct equipment for their Maths

lesson. We would prefer that they purchase their calculator through the school, as it will have all the functions available that we deem important (an Aurora AX595, @ £7.70). WisePay is now available for purchasing calculators.

Please could you remind your child ...

NOT to bring aerosols (for example, perfume, deodorants) into school or on school trips. Inhaling chemicals from the aerosols can cause allergic skin reactions,, nausea, headaches, asthma and breathing difficulties for many of our staff and students. If your child is found to be in possession of an aerosol in school or on a school trip, the item will be confiscated and made available for your collection from our Reception.

To avoid bringing food items into school that contain nuts, as we have members of our school community who have severe nut allergies.

Signing in and out during the school day

If you miss a call from school and no message is left, we would ask that you bear in mind that with the large amount of staff we have, it is unlikely that our receptionist will know who called. If the phone call is urgent, a message will be left.

Guidance in relation to Covid-19

Children and young people aged 18 and under with a positive COVID-19 test result, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days, as this is when individuals are most infectious. Students are more than welcome to return to school on day 4, provided that they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to attend. Children and young people who feel unwell and have a high temperature, should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. Students are welcome to return to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Lost Property Update
