Statutory Requirements



Students must do one of the following until they are 18:

- stay in full-time education
- start an apprenticeship
- work or volunteer (for 20 hours or less a week) while in part-time education or training

Qualifications and pathways to choose from





Post 16 Options
After Year 11 GCSEs

College

- Study a vocational course, Level 1, 2 or 3, or A-Levels.
- T-Levels available at certain colleges from September 2020.
- Independent learning leading to work, University or an Apprenticeship.

Apprenticeships

- Traineeships available at Level 1.
- Apprenticeships available at Levels 2 & 3.
- Earn as you learn. Wages + Employment+Qualifications.
- Leading to full time employment.

Sixth Form

- A-Levels with the possibility of some vocational options.
- Leading to work, University or an Apprenticeship.
- GCSE re-sits.

- Colleges will offer courses at a range of levels. In broad terms:
- Level 1 these are designed for students who have yet to achieve GCSE grades
- ► Level 2 these are designed for students who have achieved GCSE grades 1, 2 and 3
- Level 3 these are designed for students who have achieved GCSE grades 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9







Students who do not achieve GCSE grade 4 or above in August will be required to re-take the GCSE next year at college or their chosen post 16 destination.

Courses at Further Education Colleges



Vocational courses; practical and skills based



- Subjects like Mechanical Engineering, Sport & Exercise Science, Health & Social Care, Air Cabin Crew, Architecture and Interior, Childcare, Animal Management and Hairdressing can be studied as a Certificate or Diploma.
- 1yr = Certificate, Diploma, T Level depending on the course level
- 2yr = Extended Diploma or T Level (equivalent to 3 A levels)
 - MMM = 96 UCAS points, equivalent to 3 C grades at A level
 - ▶ D*D*D* = 168 UCAS points, equivalent to 3 A* grades at A level
- You study 1 subject which creates a full timetable



A Levels

2 year course with exams at the end of the two years Generally choose 3 subjects. Can do 4 if gaining high GCSE grades

Universities do not require 4 A levels; getting better grades from 3 is more helpful than not so good grades from 4, also time for a social life and super extra-curricular activities on offer! Exciting new subjects e.g. economics, photography, law, psychology, sociology, Film Studies, Graphic Design, Philosophy.







- BTEC, WJEC and CAMTEC
- Combine practical learning with theory based content
- ▶ BTECs are continually assessed throughout the course through coursework and practical projects.
- Subjects such as Applied law, applied science, applied psychology, health & social care, criminology, digital media, engineering
- You can concentrate on one subject which is the equivalent to 3 Alevels
- You can mix A levels with BTECs, WJECs and CAMTECs
- ▶ 95% of Universities accept Btecs as well as or in place of Alevels. You will need to check with chosen Uni and course.







What are T Levels?

T Levels were launched in September 2020. They follow GCSEs and when completed are the equivalent of 3 A-Levels.

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What type of study is this?

T-Levels combine classroom theory with an industry placement, which will give you the skills and experience employers are looking for.

How long does it take to complete T Levels? Full Time - Two Years. Students will generally spend 3 days in the classroom and 2 days attending an industry placement.

International Baccalaureate -IB



An international qualification, continuing to study a range of subjects

Choose one course from each of the six subject areas

Three at the Higher Level and three at the Standard Level, the content of Standard Level courses is smaller than that of Higher Level courses

Theory of Knowledge - A study of the foundations of knowledge

Extended essay - 4,000 words on a topic of particular interest in any subject

A programme of extra-curricular activities

Students need high grades across all subjects to apply and it is only offered at Varndean College in Brighton.



Apprenticeships





Apprenticeships combine training with full time work and you receive a salary.

As an apprentice, you'll:

- work alongside experienced staff and gain job-specific skills
- earn a wage, minimum of £5.28 p/h and get holiday pay
- be given time for study related to your role (the equivalent of one day a week)
- Intermediate L2 equivalent to 5 GCSE passes at grade 9 –
- Advanced L3 equivalent to 2 A level passes/Level 3 Diploma







Application Process

- Process starts now:
- Students attended assemblies from local colleges at the start of September
- Study the online prospectus or order a hard copy to be sent through the post





- Recommended that students submit post 16 applications during November and December to secure their first choices
- ▶ The deadline for Bhasvic and Varndean is Friday, 1st December 2023
- Applications are all online
- Most colleges will interview and expect you to bring your last School Report to interview including your attendance
- Students can use Year 10 Forecast Grades; Year 11 mock grades available just before Christmas.
- If requested by the college, we can provide a reference for each student.
