We are very proud to announce that former Davison pupil, Professor Emma Bunce, has been awarded an OBE for services to astronomy and science education in the New Year Honours list 2024.

This is an incredible achievement , which we wanted to share with you and also hope that you will share with your daughters.



Emma is a British space physicist and Professor of Planetary Plasma Physics at the University of Leicester. Currently Director of the Institute for Space at the University of Leicester and formerly Head of the School of Physics and Astronomy, Professor Bunce is playing a key role in ESA's JUICE mission to Jupiter, which launched earlier this year, and has been involved in multiple international space projects.

Lost Property Reminder!


- Students can look through un-named lost property in Student Services during break, lunchtime and also before and after school.

Water Bottles, Breakfast & Antihistamine!

Please can all students bring a water bottle to school with them, and be encouraged to have breakfast and any required antihistamine before coming to school.



Maths Equipment

Please ensure that your child has the correct equipment for their Maths

lesson. We would prefer that they purchase their calculator through the school, as it will have all the functions available that we deem important (an Aurora AX595, @ £7.70). WisePay is now available for purchasing calculators.

Please could you remind your child ...

NOT to bring aerosols (for example, perfume, deodorants) into school or on school trips. Inhaling chemicals from the aerosols can cause allergic skin reactions, nausea, headaches, asthma and breathing difficulties for many of our staff and students. If your child is found to be in possession of an aerosol in school or on a school trip, the item will be confiscated and made available for your collection from our Reception.

To avoid bringing food items into school that contain nuts, as we have members of our school community who have severe nut allergies.
